# Application Timeline

## Immediately:

- Maintain highest GPA possible
- Gain relevant field and research experience
- Get to know your faculty members

## Junior Year:

- Research graduate programs and potential faculty advisors
- Send out information requests to schools
- Determine application procedures, exam requirements and deadlines
- Study for and possibly take entrance exams
- Sign up for additional classes you may need for senior year

## Senior Year:

Sep/Oct

- Request letters of recommendation from faculty
- Take required entrance exams
- Contact perspective faculty advisors
- Start preparing application materials
- Inquire about assistantships and research other financial aid possibilities

Nov/Dec

- Mail applications (depends on program)
- Order Transcripts
- Apply for assistantships, fellowships and grants

Jan/Feb/Mar

- Arrange school visits and schedule an interview (if applicable)

3. Strive for depth rather than breadth
4. Be yourself, not the "ideal" applicant
5. Address the school's unique features that interest you
6. Evaluate experiences, rather than describe them
