Header:

Your name should be the largest element on the page and stand out. Include your phone number and personal email.

Qualifications: (This section is optional)

Showcase your top qualifications and skills through 3-5 bullets. Tailor this section to each job description, utilizing keywords to show how you have what the posting is looking for.

Education: List your degree, your expected graduation date, university city and state. GPA is optional, but recommended if above 3.0

Experience: List items in reverse chronological order, (most recent experiences first) Use bulleted statements to showcase your skills and achievements. See back page for more.

Resume Tips & Checklist

FORMATTING

- 1-2 Pages max (unless Federal)
- Typical margins are no less than .5"
- Within each section, order by starting with most recent or current experience, to least recent
- Save final draft as PDF titled: First & Last Name Resume
- Content Font Size = 10 - 13, Header = 16
- Common fonts: Avenir, Times, Garamond, Bell MT, Cambria, Georgia (easy to read)

CONTEXT

- No photos
- Bullet Point Formula: Action Verb + Skills or Project + Purpose or Result or Accomplishment

Navigating Bias in Applications

At the Career Center we believe students' identities and life experiences contribute to valuable strengths that are worth celebrating and showcasing on application materials. We also acknowledge that not all recruiters and organizations value every type of experience and identity, which can lead to bias and discrimination in the application process.

One approach to navigating bias is being clear and authentic about your identities on a resume and see which employers recognize these as strengths. One great outcome of taking this approach is that you might find a great values fit with an employer who sees you as your full self, and is excited about what your various identities bring to the table.

Another approach is being more general about your identities and experiences on a resume to protect from potential bias. Some items you might choose to be more general about or not mention would be political experience, religious groups, controversial research, disclosing of a disability, and listing pronouns. For example, instead of listing a specific faith, you could mention you volunteered at a spiritual organization. Instead of naming a specific political student organization, you could list it as a student leadership organization.

A resume is a snapshot of who you are and we encourage you to share however much of yourself feels good to you. There are many ways to approach this. If you'd like someone to discuss this with, we highly recommend a Career Center drop-in or appointment
